Users may also be required to reimburse the cost of certain third party fees and pay the cost of certain of Modernizing Medicine Gastroenterology’s out-of-pocket and travel related costs for services such as training and implementation.</p>	<p>Modernizing Medicine Gastroenterology’s clients are required to enter into contracts in forms acceptable to Modernizing Medicine Gastroenterology in order to use Modernizing Medicine Gastroenterology’s products and services. The fee is usually structured as a monthly per provider fee. An additional set-up fee may also be charged.</p>	<p>Contracts governing EPCS generally are for a defined term and may specify the types and numbers of users permitted to use the functionality. EPCS may only be used pursuant to the service guidelines specified in the agreement.</p>	<p>Prescribers of controlled substance are required to take part in an identification proofing process prior to being permitted to e-prescribe. The identification proofing process includes providing personal information to a third party to confirm the prescriber’s identity.</p> <p>Electronic prescribing of controlled substances requires the prescriber to take additional steps not required for non-controlled substance prescribing. These steps include certain additional identity authentication requirements, which require providers to register with third party service providers.</p>
